TAX AND STATE BUDGET

Under increasing spending pressure, to stop the budget deficit from rising, the Government's priority is to enhance the efficiency of expenditure while finding alternative sources of revenue.

Improving efficiency is associated with reforms in the State apparatus operation and payroll, as well as enhancing public investment quality. Meanwhile, expanding revenue is attached to broadening the tax base.

However, raising taxes needs to be done cautiously as this will affect savings and reduce investment in production. High tax can also encourage fraud and tax evasion and thus cause tax losses and lead to market distortion due to unfair competition practices. TAX REFORM CRUCIAL FOR STATE BUDGET SUSTAINABILITY

Viet Nam has implemented many tax reforms, including the introduction of the Value Added Tax Law in 1997 and Corporate Income Tax Law in 1999. The current proportion of VAT, CIT and import-export tax in Việt Nam's total budget revenue is higher than in other middle-income developing Asian countries, so the expansion of this tax source is unlikely. Taxes that Viet Nam may expect to increase in the future include personal income

tax, excise duty, natural resources tax and property tax. With personal income tax, tax collection in 2014-18 averaged only half of that of middle-income developing countries. However, to make tax increases possible, there needs to be a mechanism to control income sources, and more importantly, to raise people's incomes, driven by stable and faster economic growth.

COMBATTING TAX AVOIDANCE TO ENSURE A FAIR DEAL FOR ALL

The OECD **conservatively** estimates that every year, USD 100 to 240 billion in corporate tax revenue is lost to BEPS. Although these stakes are high for governments **around the world**, for developing countries BEPS is of particular significance. UN tax committee's Membership, composition and term of office

The Committee comprises 25 members nominated by Governments and acting in their expert capacity. The members, who **are appointed by the Secretary-General** after notification is given to ECOSOC, for **a term of four years**, are drawn from the fields of

Based on the collection source, the State coffers rely heavily on domestic revenues, accounting for more than 80 per cent of total budget revenue since 2016. Of which, the contribution of land fees is increasing, from 9.6 per cent of domestic revenue in the 2006-11 period to nearly 14 per cent in 2016-18.

Viet Nam approves 30 pct corporate income tax reduction The Government has decided to implement a 30 percent corporate income tax (CIT) cut for certain businesses for the 2020 financial year. Viet Nam's National Assembly on June 19 ratified the Government's proposal to cut corporate income tax by 30 percent. According to Decree No 114/2020/NĐ-CP, all enterprises, cooperatives, agencies and organisations established under Vietnamese law and generating income of no more than 200 billion VND (8.58 million USD) a year are eligible. The 30 percent reduction is only applicable to income generated in 2020. In cases of a newly established enterprise or those which have changed their form, ownership, or have undergone consolidation, merger, acquisition, dissolution or bankruptcy in a month, the operation period shall be counted for the full month. In cases where the enterprise expects total revenue in the 2020 corporate income tax period to not exceed 200 billion VND they shall determine the quarterly temporary payment equal to 70 percent of the payable CIT amount of the quarter.
